Hello Everyone,

Following the announcement by the Victorian Government this morning, Victoria is moving into a 7 day period of lock down in response to the recent Covid outbreak.

The Victorian Government has stated that from midnight tonight (27th May) until midnight Thursday, 3rd June all students who "can" learn from home 'must* learn from home.

As per Victorian Government guidelines, the only students who can attend onsite are:

- * Children whose parents cannot work from home and there is no other care option;
- * Vulnerable children;

Students who do attend school will be supervised in the completion of their remote learning packs, they will not be participating in "normal" classroom learning activities.

Cross Country Results

Perfect conditions for our annual cross country event held last Friday. The sun was out, warm rays drifting down to greet our runners and supporters, in preparation for the event. The students were looking extremely colourful wearing their sports team colours. There was plenty of enthusiasm and support from family and friends and fantastic efforts from all the participants.

A change to the format for the day meant that all students were out running on the track at the same time, allowing for more action and viewing for the spectators along the track near the finish line. The first group to leave the start was the 3km race for the Year 5/6 children. Year 5 students Lenny Campbell and Max James battled it out in front for the entire race with Lenny being the eventual winner. Olivia Day certainly showed her prowess over the distance, matching it with the boys, coming in 3rd overall and the first girl to cross the finish line.

The 1km event for the Foundation and Year 1/2 children was an enjoyable event to watch as so many of these children ran extremely well and with big smiles on their faces! Chase Glendenning was the overall winner of the event, closely followed by Henry Castagnetti. The first girls to cross the finish line, Bonny Febvre just ahead of Atelaita Cokanauto ran in 3rd and 4th respectively. To round out the top placing for both the boys and girls were Memphis Voss and Hailee Marjanovic. Harlan Raeburn was the first Foundation boy to cross the line, finishing 9th overall, and the first foundation girl was Kamalei Cokanauto.

The final event was the 2 km race for the Year 3/4 students. Again this was another close battle with Jimi Pell taking out line honours after a sprint finish, followed closely by Judd Campbell and Charlie Allen, who closed the gap on the two frontrunners over the last 500 metres. The first girls to cross the finish line were Emma James ahead of Chloe Littel and Mahlee Hartwig.

The sportsmanship during and at the end of each race was excellent with participants congratulating each other and encouraging those that were still running. Individual year level winners were:

The over team result was once again very close. Points are scored for the finishing position of every student: 1 - 10 = 10 points, 11 - 20 = 9 points, 21 - 30 = 8 points, etc. The final results for each team are then divided by the total number of students in that team to get an average point score for each student. Team results were:
