

A note from CASEA - Natural and Logical Consequences

Consequences help children understand behavioural expectations. A **natural consequence** is one that occurs without parents imposing it. For example, if your child doesn't tidy her room the consequence might be that they are unable to find their favourite toy. A **logical consequence** is one imposed and related to the behaviour you want to discourage. For example, if your child's wears muddy boots inside they will need to clean it up.

Keep consequences age appropriate and fair

Be sure you can follow through with the consequences you set up

Make consequences immediate

Make consequences natural or logical and non-punitive.

Make consequences short and direct. Keeping them short (e.g. T.V off for 10 minutes because siblings are fighting over it) means they will have the opportunity to solve the problem differently when it comes back on. If it's off for the rest of the day they do not have the opportunity to learn how to solve it differently.
